

Day Camp 2022 Information Package

About the Program

Our program runs from Monday to Friday at 1-4pm at the Biggar Jubilee Stadium (the rink at 402-2nd Ave East). Our program is for children 5-12 years old (must have completed kindergarten). We do several activities throughout the summer including games, crafts, swimming days, dress up days, and much more! This summer's rates are:

\$120 / Child

\$175 / Family (Max 3 Kids)

\$10 / Day (drop-ins)

Drop off/Pick up

Monday – Thursday, drop off and pick up will be at the front entrance of Jubilee Stadium. If someone else is picking up your child(ren) make sure to let me know as well. On Fridays, drop off will be at the BCS playground, and pick up will be at the pool.

Drop In

Additional registration forms are available at the Town Office and on the Town website (www.townofbiggar.com). Once you have filled out the registration form, please return it to the Town Office and we will mark you down as registered. Forms can also be brought directly to Day Camp. Please come speak to me if there are any special accommodations (allergies, illness, disabilities, etc.) that our staff should be aware of.

Registration / Child Release

All of the fields marked in **BOLD** need to be filled out on every form for every child. The other fields only need to be filled out on the oldest child's form if registering more than one child. This means if you are registering 3 children, you can supply contact information on your oldest child's form to save you the time of writing it out three times. On the back of the forms, you will find a section labeled "Child Release Information." When someone comes to pick up your child who is not included on this list, we will not release your child to them without contacting you first.

Injury Report Forms

In the event that your child gets injured, our staff will fill out an Injury Report Form, which allows us to document the child's injury. When you arrive to pick up your child, we ask that you read over the form and then sign the bottom of the form to verify that you have read the report. This is our way of documenting all injuries that occur at the Day Camp to mitigate any troubles with the hospital or your doctor, should an issue arise in the future. The injury report form outlines what happened and how we dealt with the issue.

What to Bring

- Bathing Suit/Towel (**We sometimes go to the splash park so please have it packed just in case. On Fridays we go to the pool or football field for water days**)

What not to Bring

There are some things that were brought last summer that we had to keep until home time and thought we would just outline them here so you have prior warning.

- Money for the Candy Machines
- Outside Toys
- Pop/Candy
- iPod/electronics

Snack

We have an allotted snack time every day, so please make sure your child is sent with a snack. We encourage a healthy snack for all children and counsellors. We prefer that pop, candy, chips, etc. stay at home and are not packed for snack.

Fridays:

Fridays will either be for swimming or wacky water day.

If it's a swimming day what to bring:

- We will meet at Sandra Schmirler Park (across from Daycare building)
- Pick up will be at the pool
- Bring money if your child does not have a pass (5 and under are free, 6-12 year olds are \$5)
- Bring appropriate swim wear
- Bring towel
- Bring snack

If it's a wacky water day what to bring:

- We will meet at Sandra Schmirler Park (across from Day Care building).
- Pick up on Wacky Water Day will be at the Sandra Schmirler Park.
- Kids are encouraged to bring water guns as we will be going down to the football field to have a water fight, slip and slide, and other water games!

If the weather is unfavorable for swimming or wacky water day, Day Camp will be held at the rink as usual. A decision will be made by 11:00am, and a post will be made on the Facebook page to let parents know if they should be dropping off their kids at the rink. If you have not heard from us and have a question about where drop off will be, you can call/text me and ask, or it will be on the Facebook page!
